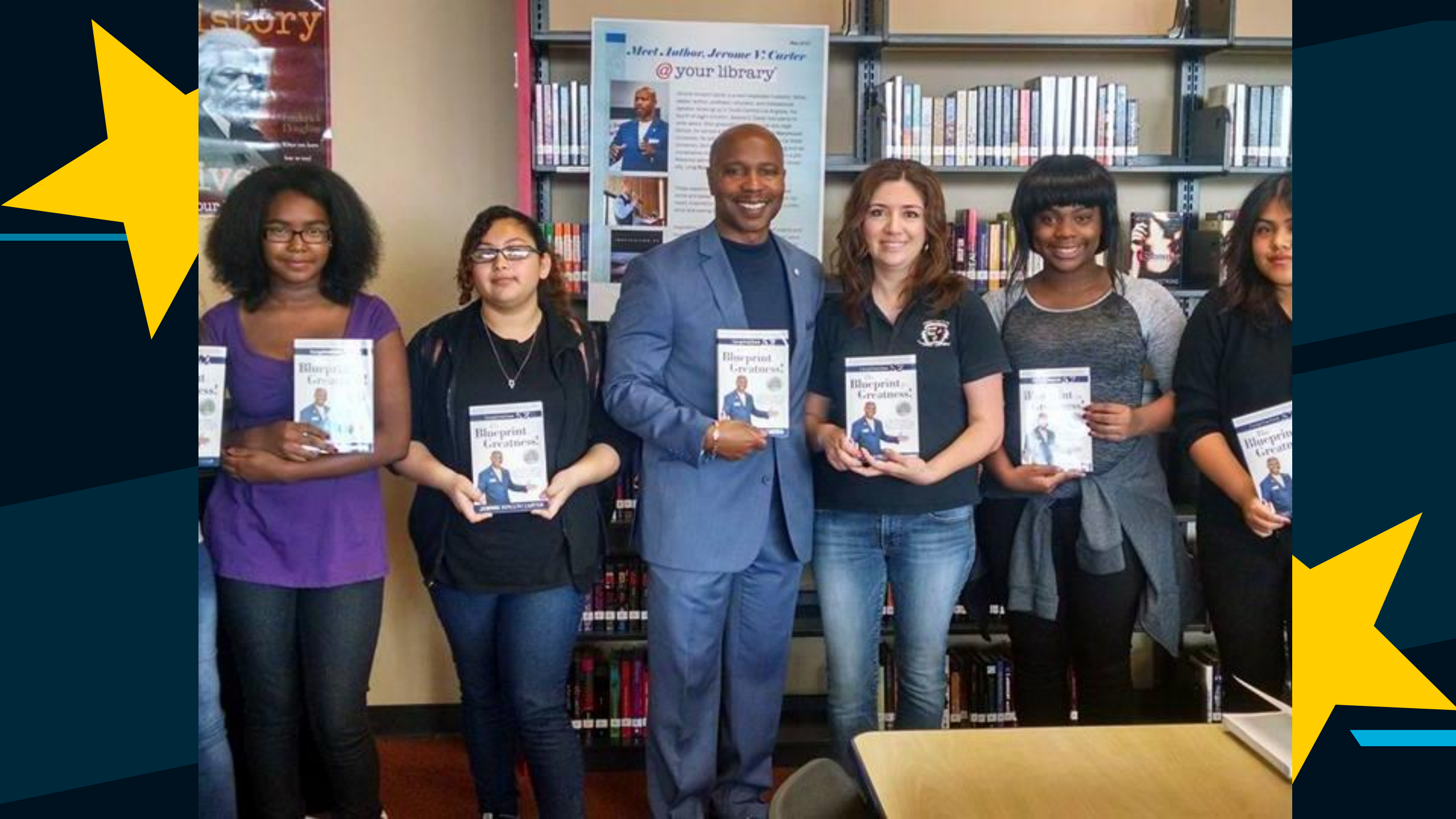

How will the partnership address root causes that are adversely impacting outcomes for black students and their communities?

The seminars and principles taught to students and parents by Professor and Son will address the root causes that are adversely impacting outcomes for black students and their communities. Disproportionate Suspension Rates, Drop Out Rates, Lack of College/Career Readiness and Chronic Absenteeism coupled with Low Test Scores are a reality for many black students in Los Angeles. Many of the root causes that adversely impact outcomes for black students and their communities have to do with low socioeconomic status, community violence, unemployment rates, absent fathers, systematic racism and the breakdown of the black family.

Our program teaches students the value of character and the value of academics, which leads to better school performance. Students are also given College and Career Readiness Training so that they are prepared for college life and the career field. This preparation addresses the root cause of low socioeconomic status and unemployment rates. It improves students chances of graduating high school, being accepted into college and obtaining a career. The skills we teach parents lead to lasting change in their household which help foster better parent child relationships and stronger communities.

How will you monitor the partnership to determine if the BSAP success indicators are improving? This includes making adjustments before the end of the school year.

- Professor and Son team members will take note of students behavior, character growth and improvement
- After each lesson students are given the opportunity to share what they've learned
- Biweekly Student Check-Ins with Teachers, Coaches and Parents will help determine students improvement
- Likert Scale Assessment for Teachers to complete monthly will determine BSAP success and improvement
- Professor and Son will review these monitoring tools and make necessary changes
- At the end of the school year students, teachers and parents will be given a survey
